

## RECOMMENDED ONESIE PATTERN FOR: The Simunye Project

### VEST PATTERN GUIDELINES:

- 1) Please use double knitting (DK) weight yarn.
- 2) Use easy care yarn. It says to use "wool" but that is really the generic term for yarn.
- 3) The pattern is called a "vest" because it's in Australian English, but it's really a little onesie.
- 4) They ask that we stick with the pattern as written rather than getting creative, because it's a style that they find works well for them in the orphanages.
- 5) However, they did say bright colors and stripes are very welcome.



### NEWBORN

Cast on 44 stitches.  
Work 18 rows in rib (K2 P2)  
Work 30 rows in stocking stitch ( 1 row K, 1 row P)  
Cast on 12 stitches at the beginning of the next two rows.  
Work 22 rows in rib  
Rib 21, cast off 26 stitches, rib 21  
Rib 21, cast on 26 stitches, rib 21  
Work 22 rows in rib  
Cast off 12 stitches at the beginning of the next two rows.  
Work 30 rows in stocking stitch.  
Work 18 rows in rib  
Cast off 44 stitches. Sew up side seams.

### LARGER SIZE

Cast on 70 stitches.  
Work 18 rows in rib (K2 P2)  
Work 48 rows in stocking stitch ( 1 row K, 1 row P)  
Cast on 40 stitches at the beginning of the next two rows.  
Work 30 rows in rib  
Rib 55, cast off 40 stitches, rib 55  
Rib 55, cast on 40 stitches, rib 55  
Work 30 rows in rib  
Cast off 40 stitches at the beginning of the next two rows.  
Work 48 rows in stocking stitch.  
Work 18 rows in rib  
Cast off 70 stitches. Sew up side seams.
