

“THREE IN ONE” SHAWL PATTERN  
Designed by L. Tramm

This shawl pattern is easily knit by any level knitter. It is easy enough for a beginner, but also has enough to keep the experienced knitter busy. It is adaptable to any knitting tension. If you are a tight knitter use a 15 needle, a looser knitter can use an 11 or 13 needle. Knitter’s choice!

**Size:** The shawl should end up approximately 22 - 24 inches wide and approximately 60 inches long. Don’t be too concerned if you are a little narrow as blocking usually widens the shawl. There is no fringe on this shawl as they tend to tangle. Using up both skeins of yarn should give you adequate size.

**Materials:** 2 skeins of Lion Brand Homespun  
Needle size according to your tension – circulars seem to work best, they will keep the weight of the shawl in your lap  
tapestry needle to weave in ends

**INSTRUCTIONS**

Pattern is a multiple of 6+3

Using long tail cast-on, CO 39 sts.

Knit 6 rows of garter stitch (including cast-on row, this is 3 ridges)

Row 1: K3, P3 across ending with K3

Row 2: Knit across

It may be helpful to mark the K3 P3 rows with a pin. On the side with the pin, you always do K3, P3.

Continue alternating rows 1 & 2.

End with 6 rows of garter stitch (3 ridges)

Bind off *loosely*.

The shawl can then be wet and lightly dried on gentle cycle of dryer.

While still damp, fold in half and gently block to desired width.

*Glossary:* CO = cast-on  
K = knit  
P = purl  
Garter stitch = knit every row
